FINE MOTOR SKILLS

- Hold a pencil and color a picture
- Write first name
- Trace lines and shapes
- Use scissors to cut basic shapes



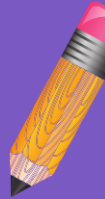
ACADEMIC SKILLS

- Count to 20 and recognize numbers 0-10
- Sing and say ABCs
- Identify letter names (out of order)
- Follow directions from adults



SOCIAL SKILLS

- Sit and listen to a story read for 5+ minutes
- Play a game fairly and accept losing
- Take turns while playing and share
- Complete short tasks independently
- Control emotions without tantrums



SELF RELIANCE SKILLS

- Use the bathroom on their own
- Take shoes on and off
- Zip, button, and snap fasteners
- Recognize first and last name
