The School & Community

The Rock Academy is an independent, faith-based, PK-12th grade school. Founded in 2002, the Rock Academy launched with thirty-eight students, grades K-6. In 2003 the Rock Academy expanded to serve 7th and 8th grade students. In 2007 the Rock Academy re-located to its current location in Point Loma and launched the high school. The Rock Academy now serves over 500 students PK-12th grade and offers \$1.5 million in tuition assistance to approximately 40% of its students annually. The Rock Academy is the only faith-based school serving the greater downtown area of San Diego.

The Rock Academy Difference

At the Rock Academy, we believe education is more than academics; it's about shaping the whole student. Our difference is found in the intentional integration of faith and learning, where students are challenged to think deeply, communicate with confidence, and live out their faith as "Do Something" Christians. With small class sizes, dedicated teachers, and a vibrant, diverse community, we cultivate resilience, leadership, and character so that every student is prepared not just for college, but for life.

Advanced Placement and Honors Courses

Rock Academy offers 10 AP courses and 3 Honors courses. The school does not limit the number of Honors or AP classes a student may take each year.

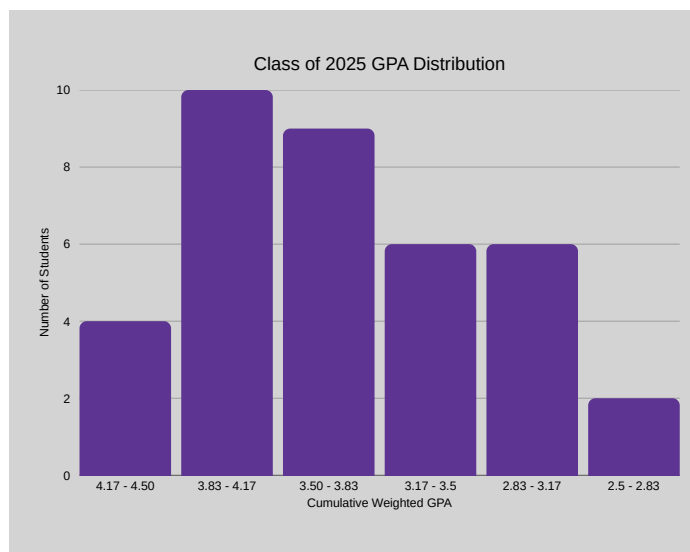

COVID-19

Rock Academy closed March 13, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 18, 2020, all High School students resumed instruction remotely in a synchronous format. All students continued to receive letter grades for their second semester coursework. Instruction for the 2020-21 school year began remotely on August 26. After receiving permission from the San Diego County Health Department, students were welcomed back to campus on September 1 in a hybrid fashion with half the students alternating between days on campus and days learning remotely.

Students who wished to participate exclusively remotely were allowed to do so. For the 2022-23 school year, the school fully reopened in compliance with CDC guidelines.
